## YOUTH DEVELOPMENT STAFF CHALLENGES

**Youth Development Staff Challenges** help staff explore what it means to be a cause-driven leader at the Y, fostering achievement, relationships, and belonging in youth. Use the challenges to support staff development and to have a little fun!

#### **PREP TIME:** Varies

**ACTIVITY TIME:** Varies

#### SETTING: Group

**GOAL:** Create a fun, competitive culture for ongoing staff development.

- 1. **Create a space.** Establish a special location, such as a staff bulletin board, for staff to share their accomplishments.
- 2. Produce the challenges and rewards. Print the challenge cards and distribute them to staff. Print the three badges: Trek, Rescue, and Hustle.
- **3. Reward and celebrate.** As staff complete the challenges, celebrate their success by awarding them the appropriate badge. Ask staff to visually display their badges and challenge responses on the staff bulletin board.
- 4. **Reflect on the challenges.** Ask staff to reflect on what they gained from the challenges. What did they like? What would they add or take away from the process?
